



**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN
HUE UNIVERSITY OF AGRICULTURE AND
FORESTRY, HUE CITY, VIETNAM
AND
UNIVERSITY OF NEW ENGLAND,
ARMIDALE, AUSTRALIA**



This is a Memorandum of Understanding entered into, by and between Hue University of Agriculture and Forestry (referred to as HUAF), Hue City, Vietnam, and the University of New England (referred to as UNE), Armidale, NSW, Australia.

ARTICLE I

The Memorandum of Understanding is intended to promote mutual cooperation for the advancement of knowledge and intellectual development, HUAF and UNE hereby establish an academic link.

ARTICLE II

The academic cooperation between HUAF and UNE, shall be in accordance with the following activities:

- * exchange of academic staff, researchers and students
- * implementation of joint research
- * implementation of workshops and training activities
- * other activities as agreed upon by both parties.

ARTICLE III

This Memorandum of Understanding shall take effect from 1st March 2016, after confirmation by the leaders here to affix their signature. This Memorandum of Understanding will remain in force for a period of five (5) years and may be amended upon mutual agreement of both parties. Either party may terminate this Memorandum of Understanding by informing the other party six (6) months in advance.

ARTICLE IV

Nothing in this Memorandum of Understanding creates an agency, partnership, joint venture or employment relationship between the parties or any of their respective officers, employees, contractors or agents. This Memorandum of Understanding is only to express the intentions of the parties. The expressed intentions are not binding and no legally-binding obligations are intended to, or do, arise as a consequence of the signing of this Memorandum of Understanding. Actions taken by either party in reliance on this Memorandum of Understanding will be at that party's sole risk.
